

Sociology Core Courses

Fulfilling the core courses (19 units) in Sociology takes, at minimum, 3 semesters. This is the path through the core courses and the order in which students may take classes:			
			Semester Taken
Semester 1:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Take SOC electives Note: First semester juniors can also try to get into SOC 300 (see Semester 2, below). However, most students do not get in until they are second semester juniors. Don't be alarmed: it only takes three semesters to complete the core courses. 		
Semester 2:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> SOC 300 (GWAR) To take 300, you must be a declared Sociology major and have taken one Sociology course with a grade of C or better (can be transferred from community college or other university) 	4	
Semester 3:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> SOC 392 SOC 370 or 371 	4	4
Semester 4:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> SOC 393 or 394 SOC 500 or 501/502 	4	3
Other important details:			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> 300 is the first course you must take in order to begin the core course pathway. You may take more than 3 semesters to complete the core courses, but 392 is the pre-requisite of 393 / 394 and 392 and 370 / 371 are pre-requisites of 500 and 501/502. To fulfill the requirements of the Sociology major, students need to complete 30 units of upper division coursework in core courses + electives. 			

Sociology Electives

To fulfil the electives requirement in Sociology, students must take 23-24 units of elective courses. Specific guidelines include:		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> A maximum of 12 units can be lower division (under the 300 level) One upper-division course may be taken outside of Sociology that is sociological in nature (such as Ethnic Studies, Health Ed, Sexuality Studies, Women & Gender Studies, History, etc.) and used as a substitution of one Sociology elective course with approval from a SOC faculty advisor. Students must take <u>one course</u> each of two areas: Area 1 (inequalities in the U.S.) and Area 2 (global inequalities); the rest of the required electives units can be in either of the areas.
