

### Sociology Core Courses

2020-2021

Fulfilling the core courses (19 units) in Sociology takes, at minimum, 3 semesters. This is the path through the core courses and the order in which students may take classes:

			Semester Taken
<b>Semester 1:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• SOC 300 (GWAR)</li> <li>• To take 300, you must be a declared Sociology major and have taken one Sociology course with a grade of C or better (can be transferred from community college or other university)</li> </ul>	4	
<b>Semester 2:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• SOC 392</li> <li>• SOC 370 <b>or</b> 371</li> </ul>	4	
<b>Semester 3:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• SOC 393 <b>or</b> 394</li> <li>• SOC 500 <b>or</b> 501/502</li> </ul>	4	

Other important details:

- 300 is the first course you must take in order to begin the core course pathway.
- You may take more than 3 semesters to complete the core courses, but 392 is the pre-requisite of 393 / 394 and 392 and 370 / 371 are pre-requisites of 500 and 501/502.
- To fulfill the requirements of the Sociology major, students need to complete 30 units of upper division coursework in core courses + electives.

### Sociology Electives

2020-2021

To fulfil the electives requirement in Sociology, students must take 23-24 units of elective courses. Specific guidelines include:

- A maximum of 12 units can be lower division (under the 300 level)
- One upper-division course may be taken outside of Sociology that is sociological in nature (such as Ethnic Studies, Health Ed, Sexuality Studies, Women & Gender Studies, History, etc.) and used as a substitution of one Sociology elective course.
- Students must take one course each of two areas: Area 1 (inequalities in the U.S.) and Area 2 (global inequalities); the rest of the required electives units can be in either of the areas.

Other important details:

- Courses in other disciplines but cross-listed with Sociology count as Sociology electives.
- To fulfill the requirements of the Sociology major, students need to complete 30 units of upper division coursework in core courses + electives.

**Sociology Complementary Studies (CS)**

**2020-2021**

There are multiple options for Soc majors to complete the complementary studies requirement of 12 units. Soc majors may mix and match between the following categories – minor courses, Ethnic Studies courses, and language courses.

Minor	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Completion of a minor fulfills the CS requirement</li><li>• Students may also fulfill CS with 12 units of courses that count toward any minor program (e.g. course in CJ, WGS, HED, RRS) that are not cross-listed with SOC</li></ul>
Ethnic Studies	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Any courses in AAS, AIS, Latinx, RRS, Africana Studies</li></ul>
Language	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Any courses in Department of Modern Languages and Literature Program</li><li>• AP Language transfer courses count</li></ul>

Other important details:

- Courses can be upper or lower division
- Students can use courses taken at a community college that count toward a minor or transfer as an Ethnic Studies course.
- Complementary studies classes don't appear on DPR
- Soc major advisors will confirm fulfillment of this requirement on graduation application
